

- Evaluate and improve interventions, collecting them in a tool box for interested communities



Phase 1 Explore and document

Participatory interview study

- Printed material, digital recordings
- Analysis sessions onsite & per zoom
- Miro, ondrive, dropbox

Communication & coordination

- Email, instant messaging (telegram), excel, onedrive

Public relations & advertising

Local social network (crossiety), communal website
& project website

Phase 2 Development & Implementation

Interweaving of analogue and digital tools

- On-site meetings & zoom
 - A lot of work has to be done on-site (working with the artefacts (coffee bike)

Digital Media @ Caring Communities

Pro's & con's of digital media

- Digital offers can reach more addressees
- Independence in time and space
- Hybrid sessions need very good technology (audio/camera).
- Digital analysis sessions are more exhausting (see, hear, focus)
- Working with multiple media can be overwhelming (zoom + Miro)
- Lessons learned: explore a good mix and fit it to the local conditions and necessities





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Joint activities in the participatory process - "who's data is it?"

- Joint development of the research question
- Training on qualitative methods
- Joint production of research instruments
- Data collection and interview transcription Joint analysis of the empirical material
- Joint report writing
- Joint development of intervention ideas
- Interventions -> transfer to ownership to the local setting, academic researchers rather consult and stepwise "fade out"

Shared ownership: but with resposibility for the overall process more on the scietists' side

Gradual hand-over to local ownership

Reflection of the participatory process

Participatory research is not free of power dynamics! These are many and various, e.g.

- Uncertainties: how much can we "break down" scientific methods?
 - ... without being boring and demotivating for the local co-researchers?
 - ... on the other hand: we need to assure scientific quality to the funding org.
 - ... what do co-researchers think what good scientific work is?
 - ... It needs patience for a grounded-theory based approach. Findings develop slowly from the data.
- Don't be paternalistic! Eye-level!

What participation is...

to recognise, discuss and constantly find good balances on those dynamics!

> In any case: Participation is a co-productive achievement!
